

Detailed assessment for Twynyrodyn Road Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council Executive Summary - English

Executive Summary

Merthyr Tydfil County Borough Council carries out routine air quality monitoring and assessment. During the course of this monitoring an exceedance of the annual NO₂ objective was observed at Twynyrodyn Road. The purpose of this detailed assessment was to further investigate this exceedance.

Real time NO_2 monitoring and diffusion tubes were used to determine the short term, monthly and annual NO_2 concentrations. Meteorological data and traffic data were also investigated. Traffic is considered to be the predominant source of NO_2 on Twynyrodyn Road. Wind direction and speed, along with two buildings on either side of the road being close to the pavement are considered likely to cause NO_2 to accumulate around 55 Twynyrodyn Road.

Real time NO₂ concentrations were found to be highest when there was significant levels of traffic moving uphill. This is believed to be associated with the direction commuters and visitors to the town centre and Tesco are encouraged to leave, particularly as a consequence of recent changes to the road layout and parking arrangements in the town centre.

It is considered necessary to declare an AQMA from the Western End of Twynrodyn Road to 147 Gilfach Cynon. MTCBC will then produce an action plan, aiming to reduce NO₂ concentrations. As NO₂ is associated with traffic emissions solutions to reduce the speed, improve the flow and reduce the amount of traffic will be carried out.
